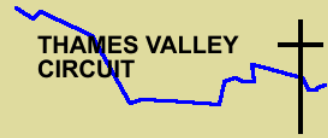

EASTER LETTER FROM OUR SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Thames Valley Circuit,

As a Circuit, we shall begin our Lenten season on Ash Wednesday with a Labyrinth Prayer Walk. This will be held on **Wednesday, February 14th at St. Andrew's Methodist Church**. This act of worship is self-led and can be done any time between 11.30am and 7.30pm. Stewards will be available to assist/pray with you. This is a good way to begin the season of Lent and I would like to encourage as many of you as can to attend.

The Circuit Training Day will be on **Saturday, March 3rd at Windsor Methodist Church**. We hope to begin at 10am with refreshments and conclude the day by 1pm. We are asking that each church send at least two people to the day. We will be looking at Working Positively Together as one group before breaking into two sessions covering pastoral visiting and how to be a good representative for your church at meetings. Oftentimes, the complaint is made that communication is poor across the Circuit. If we all know our responsibilities when we attend Council or Circuit meetings, perhaps these communication issues would improve. This is a day to share good working principles in fellowship with one another.

There are a variety of worship activities to participate in during Holy Week itself. **High Street** will be having Celtic Reflections from **26th to 28th March**. These will take place at 12.45pm and all are welcome. There are Holy Communion services on Maundy Thursday across the Circuit but if you are free in the afternoon, why not join the folk at **Old Windsor** who will be showing a film. On Good Friday, there are opportunities to join a March of Witness in Slough, Maidenhead or Windsor. As a Circuit, we are extremely grateful to visiting Presbyters who have offered to conduct Holy Communion on Easter Day itself.

As well as the Ash Wednesday Prayer Labyrinth, there are three other Circuit Services in this quarter. Firstly, the quarterly **Healing** Service takes place on **Sunday, March 4th**. As usual, this will be held at Windsor Methodist Church at 6.30pm. Come and pray for a friend, for yourself or for the world. Secondly, the **Easter Offering Service** is on **Sunday, April 15th**. This year, the venue is **High Street** and the afternoon begins at 5pm with tea followed by the service. The last event is an **Aldersgate Celebration on Sunday, May 27th in Windsor Methodist Church at 6.30pm**. More details, nearer the time.

Lent is a time to 'spring-clean' our spiritual practises in preparation for Easter. This year, I plan to use the devotional book '**The Art of Lent**'. Each day, the book looks at a different painting and offers reflections on it. The book has been written by Sister Wendy Beckett and published by SPCK. As I travel around the Circuit, I might share some of the insights from my Lenten studies with you in worship. May we all find new inspiration for the spiritual journey as we live the Easter message of resurrection and new life.
